ELECTRIC TOWER GOES DARK TO COMMEMORATE VICTIMS OF FLIGHT 3407

Marks the One-Week Anniversary of Tragedy in Clarence Center

The Electric Tower Office Building, with its brightly illuminated tower section, has been a prominent beacon in the Buffalo skyline for over 95 years. That skyline changed on February 19, 2009, as Iskalo Development left the top of the tower section dark to commemorate the one-week anniversary of the crash of Continental Connection Flight 3407 in Clarence Center, NY.

“The crash of Flight 3407 has devastated our tight-knit Western New York community,” stated Paul B. Iskalo, president and CEO of Iskalo Development Corp., owner of the Electric Tower. “Leaving the lights off on the Electric Tower is meant to serve as a gesture of remembrance to those that lost their lives in this tragic event. Our thoughts and prayers are with their families and loved ones during this very difficult time.”

One of the most recognizable buildings in the Buffalo skyline, the Electric Tower has been returned to its original grandeur including the comprehensive restoration of the building lobby and common areas, and a full building mechanical system replacement.
