Milestone Marks Key Point in Construction

Iskalo Development recently completed the structural steel at its newest development project at 2780 Delaware Avenue in Kenmore, NY. Iskalo Development president and CEO Paul B. Iskalo signed the final piece of structural steel prior to a crane raising it into place.



Known simply as 2780 Delaware, Iskalo's development project is located one block north of Kenmore at the Buffalo City Line. It was designed in the traditional "village" context, with the building positioned "street-side" for maximum visibility and the majority of its on-site parking in the rear. The site of the project is the former Kane Doyle Jeep dealership, and prime suites are still available for lease.
